I and II Thessalonians – During Paul's 2nd Missionary Journey

Review of Acts

Acts 2 Pentecost – Discuss, read Acts 2:41-47 (36 AD) Acts 3-5 Independence – Break with the High Priest and Sanhedrin, read Acts 5:27-32 Acts 7-8 Persecution Begins – Stephen and Saul, read Acts 8:1-4 Acts 9 Conversion of Saul/Paul Acts 10-11 Peter and Cornelius – Gentiles granted salvation, read Acts 11:17-18 (more?) Acts 11:19-30 – Establishment at Antioch – Read 11:19-26 Acts 12:1-3 – Second wave of persecution – Read 121-3a

James was probably instanced by the martyrdom of Stephen (Acts 7 – 37 AD) or of James (Acts 12 – 41-45 AD, commonly 44-62 AD, after 1st Missionary journey)

- 1. Was written to scattered, persecuted, Jews
- 2. Enduring suffering by persecution the first and main theme
- 3. No specific address to gentile believes would not be omitted, after 1st Missionary Journey too many Gentile-believer issues to just leave out.
- 4. If not instanced by martyrdom(s), then the book has questionable context, seems to contradict Paul (Luther), and has no other criteria for dating

Acts 13 Paul and Barnabas 1st Journey – Read 13:1-3 (47-49 AD) Acts 15 – Jerusalem Council, Read 15:1-2, 22-29, 35

Galatians was occasioned by the Judaizers and the Jerusalem Council

- 1. All about refuting the Judaizers
- 2. Clearly references events up to and including the Jerusalem Council only.
- 3. His defense in early chapters of Galatians precludes a date during of after the 2nd missionary journey.

Acts 15:36-41 – 2nd Missionary Journey, Read 15:36, 39-41 (50-52 AD)

CONTINUATION of Acts – Forward from Galatians to I and II Thessalonians

Acts 16 – Meet Timothy, Lydia, Paul & Silas Imprisoned Acts 17 – Thessalonica 17:1-4 Many converted 17:5-6, 8-10, 13-15 Run out and chased away! Acts 18 – Corinth, read 1, 8-11

I Thessalonians was instanced by the travels of Timothy – while in Corinth

1 Thessalonians 1:1, 14-16a, 17, 3:1-7

2 Thessalonians would be a contemporary following epistle, still from Corinth.
