VIII. Baptism

BF&M Statement: Christian baptism is the immersion of a believer in water in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. It is an act of obedience symbolizing the believer's faith in a crucified, buried, and risen Savior, the believer's death to sin, the burial of the old life, and the resurrection to walk in newness of life in Christ Jesus. It is a testimony to his faith in the final resurrection of the dead.

Baptism and Identification: Baptism is a means of identifying with the death, burial, and resurrection of Christ, and a means of identifying with a local church, identifying us as Christians. Our Spiritual Baptism occurs at salvation and places us into the family of God. Our physical Baptism occurs soon after salvation and places us into the family of the church.
