Genealogy of Jesus

Luke 3:23-38

Matthew 1:1-17

Two theories on why the two have different people

1. **Matthew** is through Joseph and **Luke** is through Mary - Popular modern tradition, but no clear scriptural indication
2. Explanation of Eusebius, from 3rd Century (AD 200's) is that Joseph was born through a levirate marriage - Joseph's uncle died childless and his brother took his wife and fathered Joseph. Joseph's uncle would still be his legal father. By this theory, **Matthew** is through Joseph's physical line, and **Luke** is through Joseph's legal line.
