Scripture I Samuel 1-12

I Samuel 1-3	The miraculous birth, dedication, call, and recognition of Samuel
I Samuel 4	The failure of Israel against the Philistines
I Samuel 5-6	The capture of the Arc, and God's judgements
I Samuel 7	Samuel leads Israel (by God) to conquer the Philistines
I Samuel 8, 10	Anointing of Saul

Discussion:

Note Samuel is the author of most of I Samuel. After his death, the chronicle is assumed to have been completed by his successors, Nathan, and then Gad.

Note that the Philistines were a sea-based on the Southern borders of Judea

Note the confidence of Samuel in God, he anoints Saul king in 10:01, and selects from among the tribes and elders by lots in 10:17-20.
