Romans 1:1-7	<ul> <li>Theological introduction</li> <li>1. Establishes Paul (v1, 5)</li> <li>2. Establishes the Gospel (v2)</li> <li>3. Establishes Jesus Christ (v3-4)</li> <li>4. Identifying ministry with Christians in Rome (v6-7)</li> </ul>
<b>Romans 1:8-15</b>	'More normal' introduction
<b>Romans 1:16-17</b>	Purpose - The Gospel, by faith
General Revelation Romans 1:18-20	God made His creation aware of Him
Depravity of Man	
Romans 1:21-23	Rejection of God – Idolatry replacement
<b>Romans 1:24-25</b>	God allows the rejection
<b>Romans 1:26-27</b>	Homosexuality at the forefront of depraved rebellion against God.
<b>Romans 1:28-32</b>	The extent of individual and collective wickedness

### **Discussion:**

- Note the depth of logical discourse of the book this is one where you will <u>need to read the chapter</u> before class each week.
- Note the carefully worded declarations of the theological introduction (v 1-7)
- **Discuss** the importance of vs 18-20 and the implications of General Revelation.
- **Discuss** the concept of God "giving mankind over" to their wickedness is this different from giving up on people? Why is there no judgment?
- **Preview** Chapter 2, note the topical carry-over.

Why do you think this passage highlights idolatry and homosexuality as the primary sins? What does this mean in today's culture?
