Discussion:

- **Note** the formal greetings in chapter 16 carried specific purposes of associative identification and endorsement in the faith. This does NOT mean that these greetings were not genuine heart-felt expressions of love between early Christians.

- **Discuss** verse 24 in terms of understanding a "gloss" in transmission of ancient manuscripts
