# "Forgiving Others"

## The Mandate to Forgive

- Matthew 6:9-15 (12, 14-15) The Lord's Prayer
  - o I John 1:8-10
    - Note this is regarding our walk, not salvation
    - Relates unforgiveness as sin
- Matthew 5:21-24 Context Angry with your brother
- Matthew 5:38-42 Context Giving up our rights for others
- Matthew 5:43-48 Context Love our enemies
  - o Romans 5:8, 10 as God loved His enemies

## Jesus starts with Family

- Matthew 5:21 should be taken as a literal brother, but easily applies to broader circle of family, friends, other Christians.
- Matthew 5:22 makes a distinction of contempt vs hatred, in terms of variations of judgment think of the first as slander, and the second as being equated to murder.
- Example of Fathers

## Jesus continues with Enduring Abuse and Actual Enemies

- The shirt/tunic would be a neighbor
- The mile would be a Roman soldier
- Compare to Romans 12:17-21
- Examples of Atheistic USMC Sgt, hostile coworkers

### Jesus concludes The Lord's Prayer with this

- Matthew 12, 14-15 Forgive, or we will not be forgiven
- Mathew 5:23-24 Leave the alter, reconcile, then return to alter
- Psalm 66:18 (16-20) Sin interrupts Prayer
