I and II Thessalonians – During Paul's 2nd Missionary Journey

Purpose:

- Particularly instanced by the travels of Timothy (I Thessalonians 3:1-2, 6) while in Paul is in Corinth Local and intimate
- Written because of the separation of the founding missionary and the new congregation (2:13) Encouraged by good report, a personal burden of Paul
- Written because of the active persecution (2:14-16) the Thessalonian believers were dealing with Paul doesn't really care what he WENT through, he's concerned about what they're GOING through
- Written because of their immaturity (newness, not apostasy) Written out of pastoral necessity for continued instruction (3:10, 13)

Primary Content:

- Encouragements Chapters 1-3
- Special Instructions
 - \circ Sexual immorality 4:1-8
 - Rapture 4:13-18
 - Day of the Lord -5:1-11
- Bullet-point key instructions for Christian walk 5:12-28

Similarly, II Thessalonians is extremely similar in context, being a continuation of communication during the same basic time frame (18 months in Corinth)

- Encouragement
- Special instructions Satan, the anti-Christ, final apostasy
- Key instructions for Christian walk

I Thessalonians 1:1

- ID Paul, Silas, Timothy
- Shalom more than peace, but "meaning peace, completeness, and welfare and can be used idiomatically to mean both hello and goodbye" Wikipedia
- Grace Unmerited favor, a gift, God reaching out to man. His work in us, including salvation and sanctification.

I Thessalonians 1:2-5a

- V2-3 Prayer, work of faith, Labor of love, Steadfastness of hope
- V4-5 God's love for them God's election Attested by conviction of the Holy Spirit

I Thessalonians 1:5b-7	They followed Paul & Co.'s example
	They became an example
I Thessalonians 1:8-9	Thessalonian reputation preceded them of their conversion
	from idolatry to Christianity
I Thessalonians 1:10	The End-Times emphasis of I and II Thessalonians
